Pursuant to Federal Rule of Appellate Procedure 28(j), the government respectfully submits this letter notifying the Court of pertinent developments in this case.

Today, after filing the government's reply in connection with its emergency reconsideration motion, we learned that the President certified pursuant to § 2(b)(2) of the Don't Ask, Don't Tell Repeal Act of 2010, Pub. L. 111-321, 124 Stat. 3515 (2010), that the congressionally mandated prerequisites to repeal of 10 U.S.C. § 654 have been satisfied. The Secretary of Defense and Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff have made the same certification. The certification document (attached) was transmitted to Congress this afternoon, and, as a result, repeal of § 654 will become effective on September 20, 2011. See Repeal Act § 2(b), 124 Stat. at 3516.
